**LAND DRAINAGE, ENGLAND AND WALES.
Rawcliffe Drainage District.**

**THE DONCASTER DISTRICT (RAWCLIFFE) DRAINAGE ORDER, 1931,
DATED DECEMBER 7, 1931, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES UNDER THE DONCASTER AREA DRAINAGE ACT, 1929 (19 & 20 GEO. 5. c. xvii).**

Whereas the Doncaster District Drainage Board (hereinafter referred to as "the Central Board"), acting in pursuance of section eight of the Doncaster Area Drainage Act, 1929, (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1929"), have submitted to the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, (hereinafter referred to as "the Minister"), for his approval a scheme for constituting certain lands in the parishes of Airmyn, Rawcliffe and Snaith and Cowick in the West Riding of the County of York, being a portion of the Doncaster Drainage District constituted under the Act of 1929, a separate drainage district for the purposes of the Land Drainage Act, 1930,^(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1930") and for constituting a drainage board for the district.

And whereas notices of the scheme have been published and sent to the Council of the administrative County of the West Riding of York.

And whereas no representation has been made to the Minister with respect to the scheme:

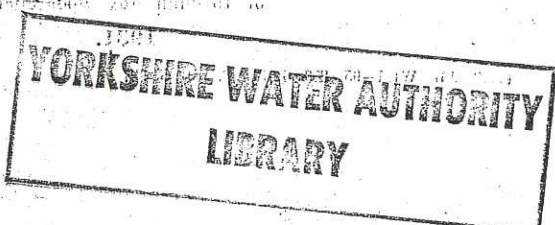
Now therefore the Minister, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him by the Act of 1929, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The lands coloured in red on the map sealed by the Minister in relation to this Order are hereby constituted a drainage district for the purposes of the Act of 1930, and shall be known as the "Rawcliffe Drainage District":

2.—(1) The drainage board for the district shall consist of seven members and shall be styled the "Rawcliffe Drainage Board."

(2) The following persons shall be the first members of the drainage board:—

John Farrand, Esquire, of Ellercourt, Rawcliffe, Goole, Yorkshire;

Frederick Hewson, Esquire, of Danum House, Rawcliffe, Goole, Yorkshire;

William Phillips Richardson, Esquire, of County Hall, Wakefield, Yorkshire;

Alec Stones, Esquire, of Pasture Farm, Rawcliffe, Goole, Yorkshire;

Kenneth Watson, Esquire, of Field House Farm, Rawcliffe, Goole, Yorkshire;

Vincent West, Esquire, of Langham Farm, Rawcliffe, Goole, Yorkshire; and

Frederick William Wright, Esquire, of Dobella Farm, Rawcliffe, Goole, Yorkshire.

(3) The drainage board shall send to the Central Board copies of the minutes of all proceedings of the board within fourteen days of the date of their confirmation.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in this Order the cloughs, sluices and other outlets, through which the water from a portion of the district discharges into the River Aire shall be controlled, operated, and maintained by the drainage board to the satisfaction of the River Ouse (Yorks) Catchment Board.

4. The expenses of the Minister and such expenses as shall be certified by him to have been reasonably incurred by the Central Board in relation to the preparation and making of this Order shall be a first charge on the rates levied within the drainage district.

5. This Order may be cited as "The Doncaster District (Rawcliffe) Drainage Order, 1931."

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries is hereunto affixed this seventh day of December, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-one.
